

**Items to Be Produced at Review Hearing  
by County Welfare Department [WIC §391(e)]**

Do not terminate dependency jurisdiction over a nonminor dependent who has attained 18 years of age until you conduct a “391” hearing and the department submits a report verifying that the following information, documents, and services have been provided to the nonminor, or the efforts made to make the following items available to the nonminor who, after reasonable efforts, cannot be located [WIC §391(e)]:

- **Written information** concerning the nonminor's dependency case, including any known information regarding the nonminor's Indian heritage or tribal connections, if applicable, his or her family history and placement history, any photographs of the nonminor or his or her family in the department's possession, other than forensic photographs, the whereabouts of any siblings under the juvenile court's jurisdiction, unless the court determines that sibling contact would jeopardize the safety or welfare of the sibling, directions on how to access the documents the nonminor is entitled to inspect, and the date on which the jurisdiction of the juvenile court would be terminated.
- **The following documents:**
  - Social security card.
  - Certified copy of his or her birth certificate.
  - Health and education summary [see WIC §16010(a)].
  - Driver's license or identification card.
  - Letter prepared by the department that includes:
    - The nonminor's name and date of birth.
    - The dates during which the nonminor was within the juvenile court's jurisdiction.
    - A statement that the nonminor was a foster youth in compliance with state and federal financial aid documentation requirements.
  - If applicable, the death certificate of the parent or parents.
  - If applicable, proof of the nonminor's citizenship or legal residence.
  - An advanced health care directive form.
  - Judicial Council form JV-466, which the nonminor uses to file a “388(e)” petition to resume dependency jurisdiction.
  - The written 90-day transition plan [see WIC §16501.1].
- **Assistance in completing Medi-Cal application** or assistance in obtaining other health insurance.
- **Referrals to transitional housing**, if available, or assistance in securing other housing.
- **Assistance in obtaining employment** or other financial support.
- **Assistance in applying for admission to college** or to a vocational training program or other educational institution and in obtaining financial aid, where appropriate.

- **Assistance in maintaining relationships** with individuals who are important to a nonminor who has been in out-of-home placement for six months or longer from the date the nonminor entered foster care, based on the nonminor's best interests.
- **Assistance in accessing the Independent Living Aftercare Program** in the nonminor's county of residence (for nonminors between 18 and 21 years of age), and assistance in completing a voluntary reentry agreement for care and placement [see WIC §11400(z)] and in filing a “388(e)” petition to resume dependency jurisdiction.
- **Preference for student assistant or internship positions.** Written information notifying the child that current or former dependent children who are or have been in foster care are granted a preference for student assistant or internship positions with state agencies [see Gov C §18220]. The preference must be granted to applicants up to 26 years of age.
